

Massing of the Colors & Salute to Our Armed Forces

THIS CELEBRATION of George Washington's birthday is the largest event of its kind in the western United States, and is in its thirty-first year. We celebrate Washington because he was truly the "indispensable man," without whom our country probably would not have been founded. He was heralded by George III as the "greatest man in the world" for stepping down voluntarily as commander-inchief of the army, and as the American Cincinnatus by his contemporaries.

Cincinnatus, a Roman patrician, was forced to live in humble circumstances, working on his own small farm, until an invasion caused him to be called to serve Rome as dictator, an office which he immediately resigned after completing his task. His voluntary resignation of absolute authority has often been cited as an example of outstanding leadership, service to the greater good, civic virtue, and modesty. Cincinnatus is depicted on the Washington Monument here at Forest Lawn.

Was Washington perfect? No. He was a man of his times in many ways, but, like all the Founders, he possessed timeless qualities that are as important, or more so, today than at the founding of our nation. Washington can still be admired as the premier example of one who embodied the principles of duty, honor, country, and selfless dedication to the cause of independence and the development of our republic.

So, today we celebrate Washington's legacy and encourage those outstanding young people here today who are following his path of public service by participating in JROTC and ROTC programs.


