

The San Fernando Valley Chapter, SAR, will hold its regular monthly luncheon at Noon, Saturday. All members, applicants and guests invited.







THE MONUMENT TO GEORGE WASHINGTON AT FOREST LAWN




This support by our neighboring Chapters insured the success of the 1994 Massing of the Colors.







OUR R.O.T.C. AWARDS PROGRAM





FIFE AND DRUM CORPS




PROGRAM
