LAURENCE ATWOOD HUMPHREY

1915 - 1994

Compatriot Laurence Atwood Humphrey was born in Pittsfield, Maine on April 23rd, 1915 and died in Van Nuys on July 29th, 1994. He was a long time member of the Los Angeles Chapter, S.A.R. and was to be transferred to our Chapter. He was a graduate of Colby College in Waterville, Maine. He joined Lockheed Aircraft in 1939 and retired in 1978. During World War II he served as a civilian technician with the 8th Air Force in Northern Ireland assembling Hudson Bombers and P-38 fighters. Later he served with the Army of Occupation of Japan. He is predeceased by his wife Dora Drake Humphrey and sons James Laurence Humphrey and Wayne Drake Humphrey. He is survived by his brother Reginald H. Humphrey an active member of our Chapter and his son Glen Holt Humphrey.

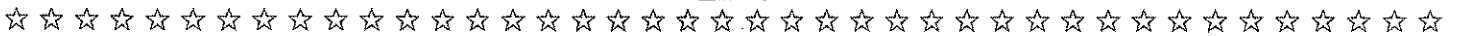
Supplemental Ancestors

He later served at Fort Ticonderoga 1777, and several other short term enlistments with the Northern Army.

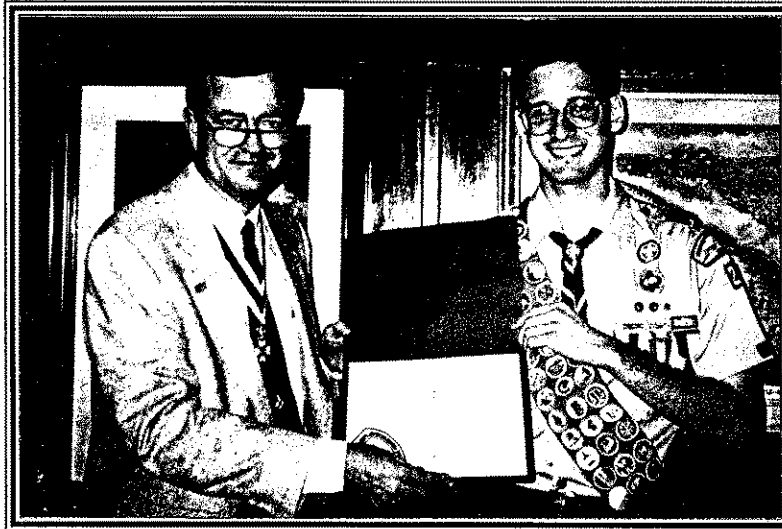


Our 1995 Eagle Scout Winner

David is a Juniper at U.C.L.A. and is involved not only with the Boy Scout program but numerous civic activities.

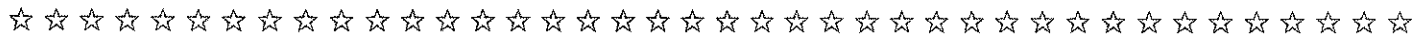
His name and numerous achievements will be forwarded to the State Society for consideration in next year's Eagle Scout award program. He is well qualified and can easily be a winner the State contests.

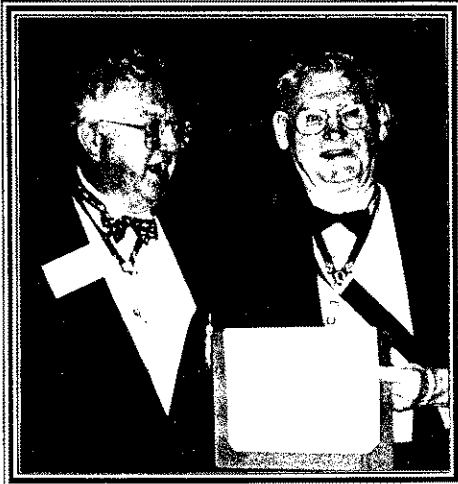
